

BATHROOMS

Designated step-free toilet areas can be found on both sides of the Gannochy Trust Auditorium and on the second floor. There are 4 toilets with adaptations available; 2 on the ground floor and 2 on the second floor. Parent and baby changing facilities are located within the toilets with adaptations on the ground floor.
